LIGHTS, FASHION, ACTION! Second ANNUAL WOMEN & FASHION FILMFEST JUNE 3- 7, 2014 to Support & Empower Women & Girls

MAY 6, 2014 (New York, NY) -- The annual <u>Women & Fashion FilmFest</u> (WFF) is returning to New York City for its 2nd edition. Part conference, part film festival, this 5-day event will unite leaders in fashion, entertainment and media to support and empower women and girls. This year, WFF is partnering with <u>LIM College</u>, which will serve as the festival's main venue.

WFF will include panel discussions with luminaries in fashion, film, television, magazines, and beauty; screenings of films made by both established filmmakers and high school and college students; workshops for girls, and a fashion show that will feature original designs from students. Among this year's confirmed participants are former *Vogue* Editor-at-Large **Andre Leon Talley**, *filmmaker* **James Belzer** (*The Tents*), who will offer an advance preview screening of his latest documentary, *Make It in America: Empowering Global Fashion* -- which examines the loss and subsequent re-invigoration of domestic apparel production in the U.S. -- Sundance Productions President **Laura Michalychshyn**, Vimeo President **Dae Mellencamp**, Fashion Director of *US Weekly* **Sasha Charnin Morrison**, and Ovation Executive VP, Network Strategy **Liz Janneman**, who will discuss *The Fashion Fund*.

"Since our inaugural festival last year, we've gained much momentum in building awareness of our platform to empower women and girls. In addition to our stellar lineup of panels and screenings, I am especially excited about our new Girls Film Festival and the Girls Empowerment Fashion Runway, which is aimed at inspiring girls and giving them the chance to express their creativity and develop their skills and talents," says WFF Executive Director Jeanine Jeo-Hi Kim, who was recently named U.S. Chair of MARITAGE International, a UNITED NATIONS affiliated platform focused on empowering women and addressing poverty by creating employment opportunities for women artisans and artists.

Says LIM College President Elizabeth S. Marcuse, "LIM College is delighted to serve as the main venue for the Women & Fashion FilmFest. We have been preparing students for successful careers in the business of fashion since 1939, so naturally we wholeheartedly



support WFF's mission as they create opportunities for, and support the professional ambitions of, girls and young women."

WFF will kick off with a Red Carpet Opening Night Benefit hosted by Celebrity Stylist Phillip Bloch on June 3rd at the Gold Bar (389 Broome St.) in Manhattan. Starting at 6 pm, fashion designers will walk the outdoor red carpet with models wearing their designs to celebrate fashion with the public. NYCEDC Director Eric Johnson, leader of many of New York City's fashion initiatives will deliver a welcoming address. WFF will also present its first *Inspiration & Visionary Award* to Sara Ziff, Founder of the Model Alliance. Governor William Paterson, Catherine Malandrino, Stephen Burrows, Timothy Greenfield-Sanders, Nigel Barker, Supermodels Pat Cleveland, Sessilee Lopez, Grace Bol, Nykhor Paul, Candace Huffine and Crystal Renn are among the Honorary Hosts. Phi Unit – Your Little Sister's Favorite DJ and Co-Founder of Building Beats, a non-profit that fundraises for DJ and music education for kids will spin the music. To inspire teenage girls to focus on leadership and contributing to society, the Girls Film Festival (GFF) will include a panel on June 6th, 6pm at LIM College (216 East 45th St.) with top models talking about their philanthropic efforts, including **Sessilee Lopez** on her work with Operation Smile, **Nykhor Paul** on promoting peace in Sudan through her initiative "We Are Nilotic," **Grace Bol** on The Roots Project that teaches arts and crafts to South Sudanese communities, and **Crystal Renn** and **Claudia Mason** on women's health and body image. The program also includes the premiere of <u>The Civic Life Project</u>'s documentary on human trafficking made by high schools students, as well as other short films made by teenage girls in partnership with several nonprofit organizations – including <u>Reel Works</u> and <u>Scenarios USA</u>.

WFF will conclude on June 7th with the Girls Empowerment Fashion Runway (GEFR), a fashion show sponsored by <u>True Model Management</u> and <u>Runway The Real Way</u> at the Yotel Hotel (570 Tenth Ave.). The show will feature designs by young designers from the <u>United Colors of Fashion</u>, a non-profit organization that provides free fashion education to under-resourced youth.
